## Senior Class History

we soon became adjusted and found our principal to be a sympathetic friend. There wasn't much to do during our freshman year with Mrs. Florence Cordova and Miss Sarah Hufham, except study and wish we were sophomores. But alas! when we became sophomores, Mr. Gannon Talbert and Mr. Sawyer guiding us, our only desire was to be sophisticated juniors. We did become juniors under Mrs. Zelma Phillips and Mrs. Gladys Lollis, and what a wonderful class we were. Although our school work became tougher, each of us enjoyed that year immensely. One of the nicest things of the whole year was our Junior-Senior banquet. It took a lot of hard work to put it over. but when we saw the results, we were really proud. In return the Seniors gave us a nice picnic. They teased us by telling us that we were going to be served bologna, sausage and water, but when we ate, what a delicious picnic supper! In retrospect, it really was a superior year.

Then, at last, we became dignified seniors. This year really has been a bonanza, filled with important events for us, with the understanding help of our senior teachers, Mrs. Helen Bailey and Miss Pearl Brinson, the most outstanding ones being our senior play, a trip to our nation's capital, the fine banquet the Juniors gave us, and the picnic we gave them in return.

All of these things were leading up to the climax--for which our high school teachers for four years had been preparing us. They had taken a personal interest in each of us as individuals and had done all that was possible to make our class career pleasant and profitable. We felt deeply indebted to them as we marched down the aisle on that beautiful evening of May 29 and took our places on the stage for graduation exercises. Our thoughts were guided to the task before us, to the social, political, and economic problems we knew we must face as we graduated from school into something bigger and more important. We had become citizens of America.
