### CLASS HISTORY

The favorite game for the girls was playing nurse and doctoring the boys, while the boys played the part of the "Warriors" and would come in from the battlefields prepared for our medical treatment. Speaking of wounds, we were all wounded by geography that year--maps, maps, and more maps. We enjoyed having Miss Capps for our teacher that year and especially enjoyed the nice Surprise Easter Party she gave us.

The fifth grade holds a memory for us which we would like to forget, and that was the memory of a nurse with a big, long needle in her hand, Ug! Our first typhoid shots. This year we all welcomed Betty Jean Taylor with her long red curls, and also another addition was Sara Nunnery.

I don't believe there is a one of us who could forget our teacher this year, Mrs. Lillian Ray, nor shall we ever forget the songs we sang--Fellow class mates, remember, "Boola, Boola" and "Coming Through the Rye"?? We were very proud of Willie Ray Heath and Rachel Wade who won the School and County D. A.R. speaking contest. Geography was still like an unmovable stone in our pathway, Ah! for recess.

Half of our school years were over, six years had seemed a long time but six more, oh my aching back! We felt as though we had just come back from Christmas holidays because Mrs. Ray was again our teacher. Our class was increased by Odell Rhue and Leonard Walker this year. Most of the girls were interested in Volley Ball but the boys on the other hand were interested in "Foolery."

Ah! the 8th grade held a lot for us, for it had seemed that it would never come. For the first time we had a man teacher, Mr. Farnell, and we really enjoyed having him, for we learned quite a lot about History, Politics, and Religion, and expecially became interested in poetry. There was the big question for the girls of, "Should I wear lipstick?" Then the big night arrived—graduation, and we all appeared awaiting our chance to walk across the stage and receive our diplomas—from grammar school to high school. Reginald Rhue joined us this year.

High School at last and we really took that first word to heart or shall I say to our heads, but we soon came down to earth when we realized just how much work we had ahead of us. Our home room teacher was Mrs. Jarvis, who was new and very pretty. Changing classes was really something new for us, and half the time we found,ourselves running up and down the hall asking what period it was. Annie Melton and Willie Ray Heath won the D. A. R. speaking contest. Our class was increased by Gunter Maness, Helen Boney, Margaret Brown, Shirley Collins, Iris Culpepper, and Evelyn Taylor. Our class officers were: Eleanor Hatsell, President; Rachel Wade, Vice President; and Pat Sewell, Secretary.

We had a new principal when we came back to school the next year, Mr. Honeycutt and a lot of new rules with him. Rachel Wade was our President; Mary Ann Midgett, Vice President; Helen Boney, Secretary; and Joyce Cannon, Treasurer. Odell Rhue, Amnie Melton, Nancy Henderson, and Eleanor Hatsell were in a debating contest and went to E.C.C. Mr. Bender was our home room teacher who we will never forget for Science and Biology. We really ended our Sophomore year with something we won't forget and that was our Class Picnic at Flanners Beach. Ah, Sweet chilly memories.

Our Junior year and we had as our home teacher the one whom we wished we would have, Mrs. Alma Warf. We ordered our rings and soon received them, most of us went around all day looking at our rings instead of where we were going. Our class funds were increased by selling magazine subscriptions from which we made \$187. We donated \$50 of our earnings for the Athletic Bus. We gave our Junior Play in February, "Don't Take My Penny," the profit of which looked good added to our funds. We have Mrs. Warf to thank for the success of our play. Nancy Henderson, Rachel Wade, Mary Ann Midgett, Shirley Collins, Alvin Smith, Odell Rhue, Carl Milsted, and Patricia Sewell all had the privilege of attending the Beta Club Convention in Ashville during April. This year Will Heath led our class as President, Vice President was Mary Ann Midgett, Secretary, Pat Sewell and Treasurer, Carl Milsted. At last the big night arrived, we put forth much labor and hard work in making the Junior-Senior Banquet a big success and it proved to be just that. Our theme was a Pirate Ship. Another big night and that was graduation. Chosen out of our class as marshalls, were Helen Boney, Patricia Sewell, Alvin Smith and Shirley Collins, with Nancy Henderson as chief marshall.

Our Senior year at last, we had come a long way and it hadn't all been up-hill by any means but we have had a wonderful time. This was indeed a busy year for all of us. At the beginning of the year we sold Christmas Candy to increase our funds and also sponsored the Sadie Hawkins Dance. We had a Christmas Party at which time we gave our home room teacher, Mr. Frazelle, a watch as a token of our appreciation for the kindness and patience he has shown us. Class officers were chosen as follows: Carl Milsted, President; Mary Ann Midgett, Vice President; Shirley Collins, Secretary; and Reginald Rhue, Treasurer. Our class play, "Murdered Alive," which was given during the latter part of the year proved to be a big success. Two main events of the year which we all looked forward to was the Junior-Senior Banquet and our trip to Washington, D. C. Finally the big night arrived, Graduation at last. We all received our diplomas with smiles on our faces and though we would miss all our class mates, we were happy. We made plans to all meet again at the school on January 1,
