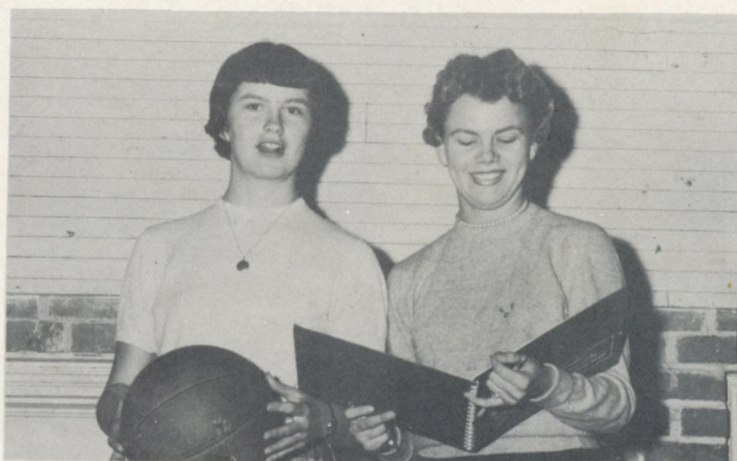
GIRLS' BASKETBALL
