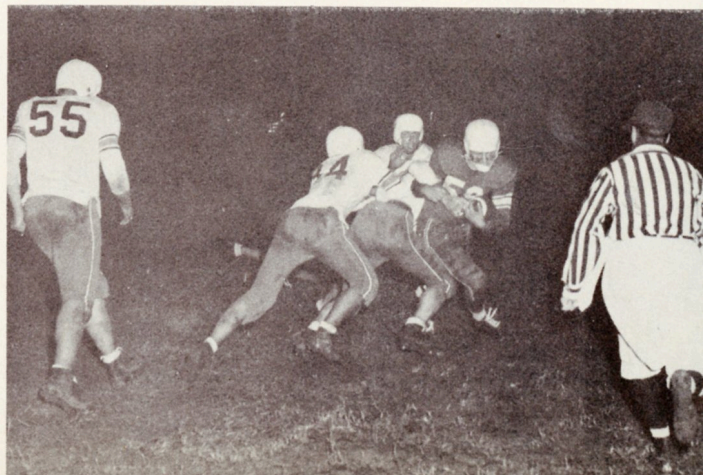
Halfback Piner goes for a short gain around the Eagle end during the Beaufort game.

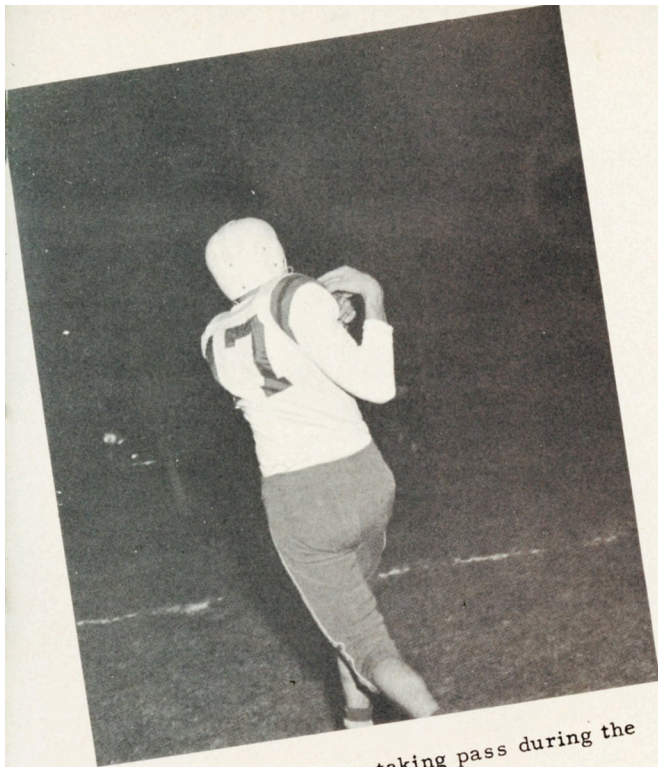

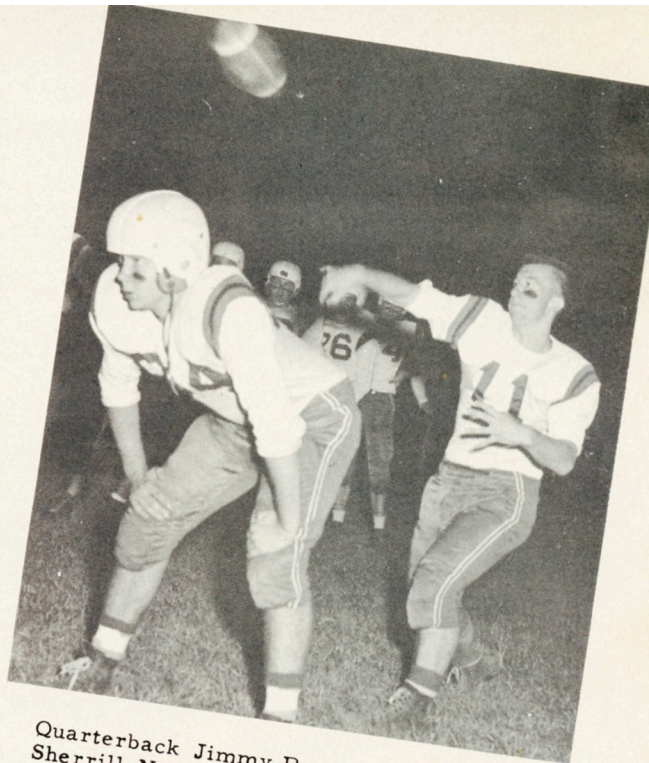

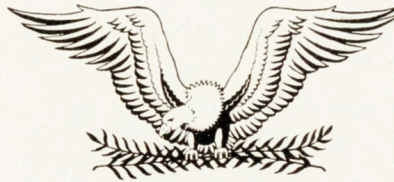

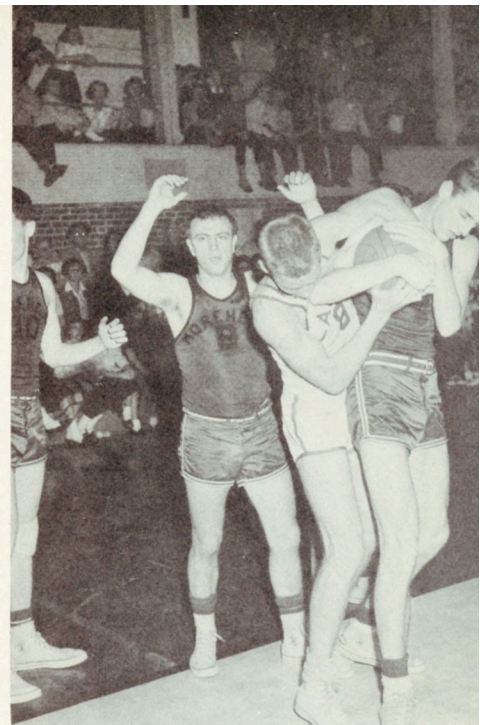

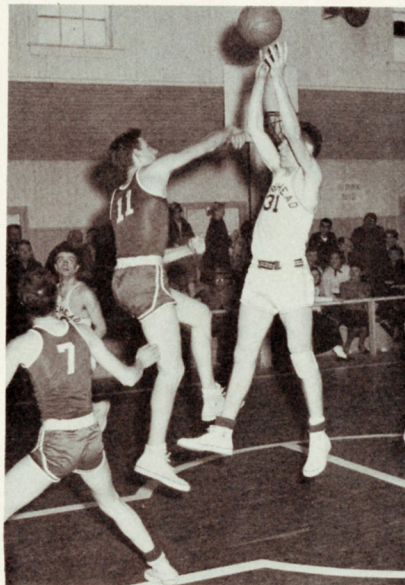

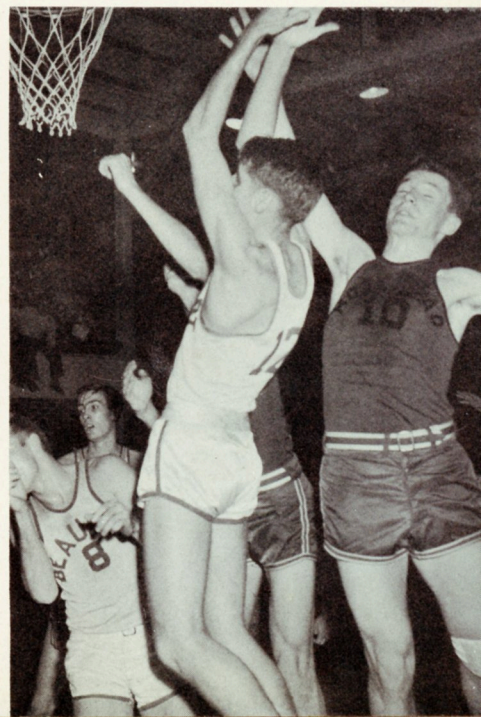
