Oh, I'd better stop a minute. Someone important must be coming, everyone's so quiet. Why it's General Lytle Smith and he's weighted down with medals.

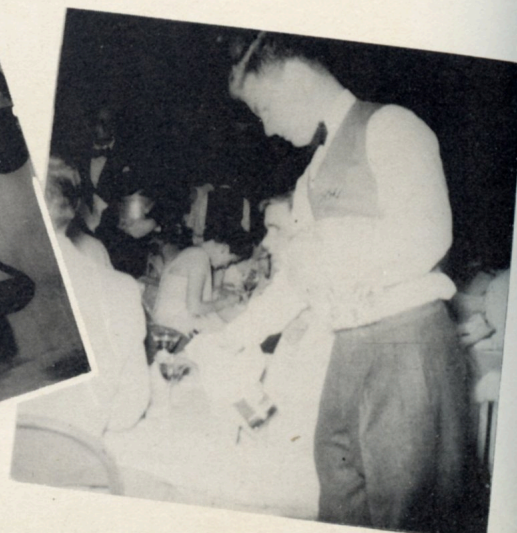
