The band is composed of forty-eight members and is directed by Mr. Ralph T. Wade, assisted by student directors Frank Sanderson and David Nelson.



Llewellyn Phillips, II is the recipient of a John Motley Morehead Scholarship to the University of North Carolina. Morehead Scholarships are awarded on the basis of merit, particular attention being paid to academic standing, character, leadership, ambition, and physical prowess. These scholarships for undergraduates are valued at \$5,000 for a four-year tenure.

Recognition for literary ability came to three MCHS students this
