Recognition for literary ability came to three MCHS students this year.

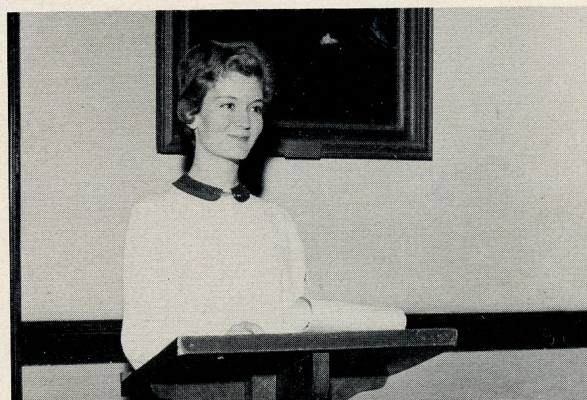
