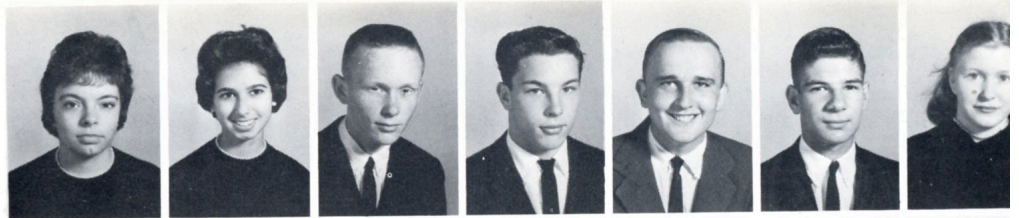
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE
