East Carteret Chosen In A State Program As A Demonstration Library!

East Carteret High School Library was selected this year as one of the five high school libraries in the state to serve as a demonstration library. In order to be selected, the library had to meet specific criteria of personnel, facilities, and library program.

The schools chosen will serve as demonstration centers which school administrators, teachers, librarians, school board members, parents, and civic leaders may visit to observe exemplary school library programs. Emphasis will be placed on facilities and materials for independent study.

A special allocation of \$8,000 was granted for the acquisition of a wide variety of materials to enrich existing library resources. The project is under the guidance of the State Department of Public Instruction and an advisory committee of local school personnel.

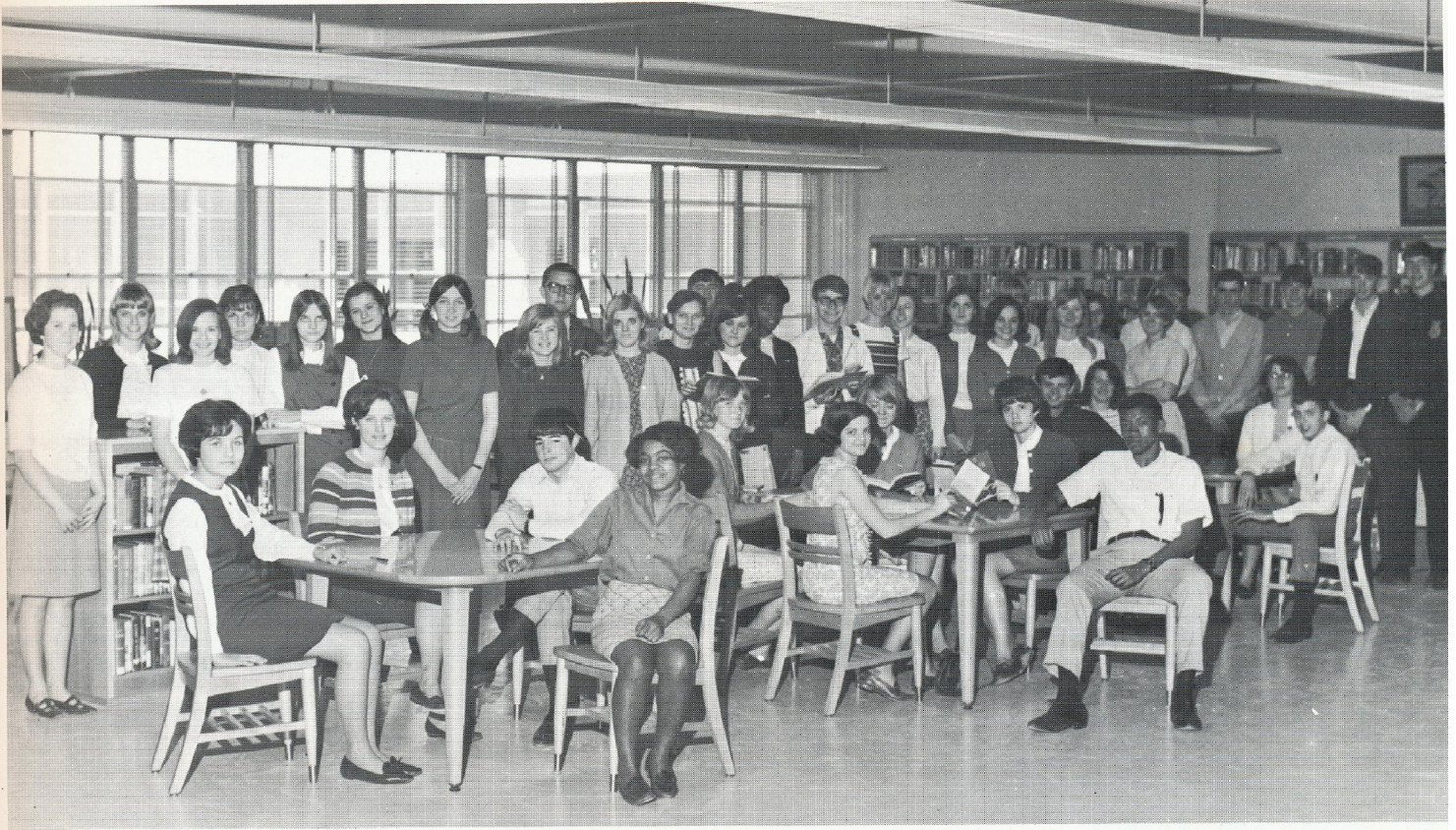
Through the efforts of the library assistants, money has been raised this year for the purchase of several pieces of sculpture and for carpeting the conference room.

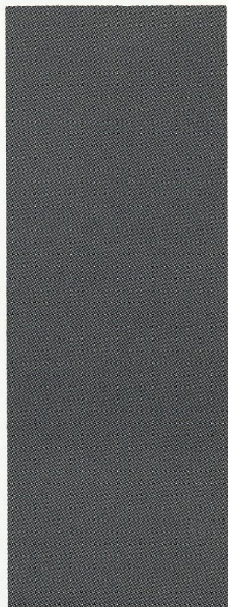
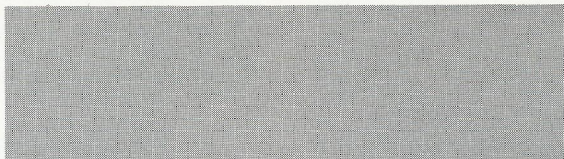
MR. VANCE MASON, JR. gains satisfaction when he sees student progress. Because of his interest, he chose Business Administration as his field of study.

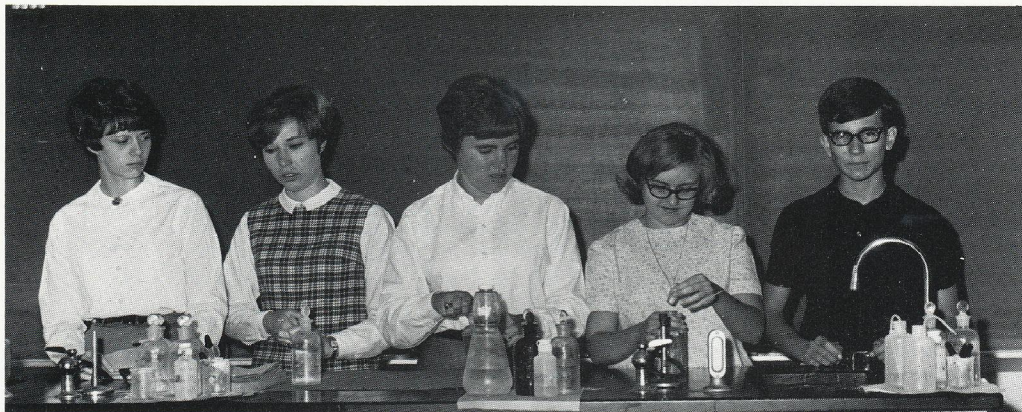
