- (4) This game may only be played Monday thru Friday from 8:30 AM to 3:30 PM.

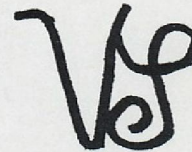

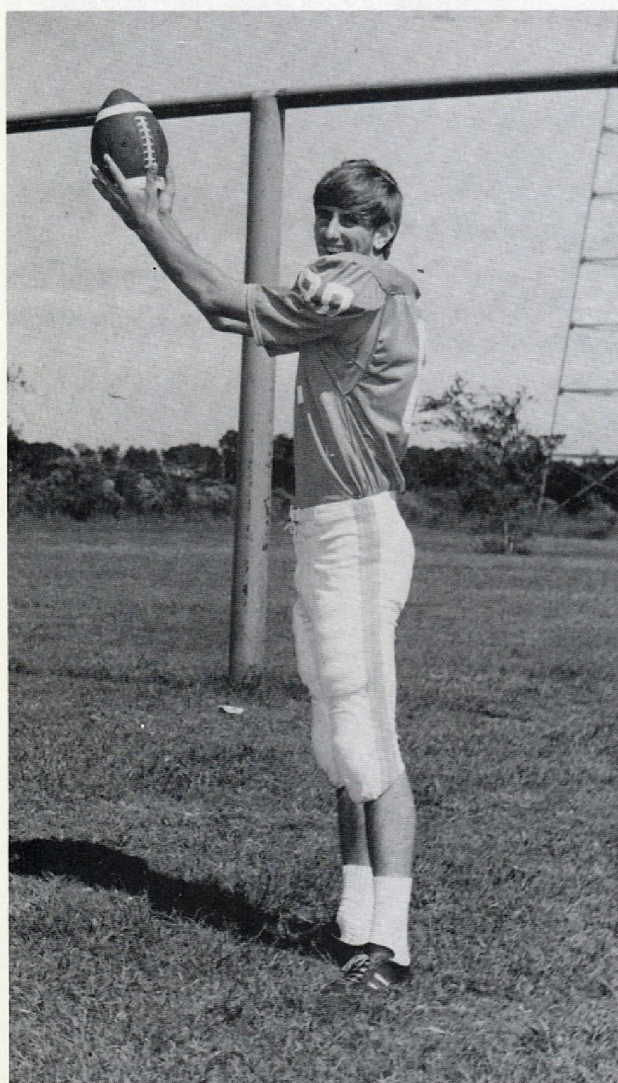


# *East Varsity has Second Straight Winning Season*
