The team fought hard to overcome their handicap that many opposing teams were taking advantage of, but just could not overcome it. Swansboro ended the season with a 2-8 record.

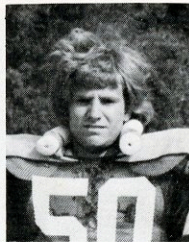




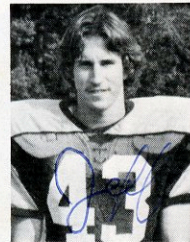

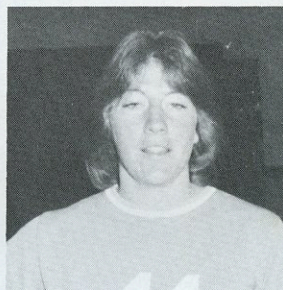
Girls Basketball
