Amy Betts, a senior at East Carteret High School, wrote a paper, "Inhibition of Barnacle Settlement by Natural Products from a Sponge." Her thesis won first prize at the state-level competition in Chapel Hill in March 1984. The paper was based on work she did the preceding summer as an office of Naval Research intern at Duke University Marine Laboratory, Piver's Island. She then traveled to Wisconsin and presented her paper at the National Junior Science and Humanities Symposium at the University of Wisconsin-La-Crosse. Amy's paper was one of seven selected by a panel of college professors to be read at the London International Youth Science Fortnight in London, England, July 25-Aug. 8, 1984. Amy received an all-expense paid trip to London along with her escort, UNC-Chapel Hill physics professor Larry Rowan.

The national contest was sponsored by the U.S. Army in cooperation with the Academy of Applied Sciences.
