Dolphins are one of nature's most phenomenal creatures and, so too, are the *Dolphins* of Broad Creek Middle School. They learn through participation in cooperative learning groups, labs, role playing, group presentations, research, debates, and independent activities. Developing organizational skills, getting along with others, and accepting the consequences of their actions are areas in which the *Dolphins* strive to improve. Meeting success has been both a challenge and a reward.

"Off the Hall Classes" — Physical Education,

The term "off the hall" refers to the classes outside of the core classes of English, mathematics, science, and social studies. All students at BCMS participate in the physical education classes. Anytime during the school year these students can be seen participating in activities that exercise and strengthen the body as well as stimulating the mind. Activities such as putt-putt golf, bowling, broom hockey, and prison ball complement the traditional PE offerings of volleyball, basketball, and gymnastics. Students also participate in the President's Physical Fitness Program.

Some students elect to take an active part in one of the cultural arts programs which include art, band, and chorus. Students may sign up to take a course for the entire year, or they may choose to sign up for a rotation either on a semester cycle or a six weeks/seven weeks cycle. The awarding of the Superintendent's Award to Gary Howe has created excitement in the art classes. The art class also visited an art showing at the county library. The chorus has been busy with a Christmas concert, rehearsing for the drug-free program entitled "The Upside of Down', and practicing for a Spring choral competition. In addition to Christmas and Spring concerts with the chorus, the band performed at two basketball games this year.

The career exploration classes are conducted on a rotation based on the students' grade placement. Students explore career choices through the Business Lab, the Industrial Lab, the Service Lab, and the Environmental Lab. Many hands on activities are incorporated into the various lab programs. Students who take these classes may belong to the CECNC. Members of CECNC compete in county, regional, and state competitions as well as participate in the clean highway program.














