

The fifth edition of the Broad Creek Middle School yearbook, an anniversary edition, was printed by Delmar Publishing Company in Charlotte, North Carolina. The cover was Zebu gray with black and maroon ink. The book was printed on 80 pound gloss enamel paper with black ink. The four-color eight page gatefold was printed on 100 pound gloss enamel paper. Headline and body copy were printed in Benquiat Book type in sizes ranging from 8-18 point. Four hundred and fifty copies, 8 ½ inches by 11 inches, were printed containing seventy-two pages each. The books sold for sixteen dollars until delivery when the price increased to eighteen dollars.


