






Clockwise from top: Junior girls stop for a quick pose. Coaches Matt Poulk, Nate Jones, and Lupton Haigler discuss useful strategies.



Both the Concert and Symphonic bands scored straight superiors, the highest rating, at the Eastern district Concert Festival in Jacksonville, NC, on March 22, 2000. 









The Team That Almost Wasn't














Men's Golf


