
Beta Club

trip to the North Carolina Museum of Art in Raleigh. NAHS is a terrific outlet for those who wish to express themselves artistically.












Making an Impression












Boy's track adjusts to changes but remains successful through it all


Mr. Eades


Mrs. Hudnall

EAST CARTERET HIGH SCHOOL TEACHER OF THE YEAR



There are some people we meet in life, who touch us more than any one person could. If we, the yearbook staff, could have one wish for every person, it would be that they spend an hour with Ms. Julia Brown, the ECHS 2000-2001 Teacher Of The Year. Just an hour with Ms. Brown and it would be impossible not to feel the desire to teach. Her energy, enthusiasm, and love for her students radiates out from her like a beacon at night. The knowledge which she possesses, and the dedication that she shows, is truly uncontainable.

As a "Sansei"-a Third Generation Japanese-American born in Stockton, California, Ms. Brown notes that she was always taught the importance of education and was expected to excel throughout her educational career. Her passion for becoming a teacher came when she was in fourth grade. That year, President John F. Kennedy was assassinated and her teacher chose her to perform the assembly speech after reading her essay on the event. She said she cried for days prior to the event, but she read it; and because her teacher had faith in her, she was able to achieve that goal, and she wanted to help students achieve their goals from then on. Ms. Brown attended Franklin High School where she was class Valedictorian, Student Body Vice-President, California Girls State District Attorney, a member of the Chess Club, and a member of the Future Teachers of America. While in high school, she said that her favorite subjects where English, speech and debate, chemistry, and in her senior year, trigonometry. In addition to all her other extracurricular activities, Ms. Brown was also 2nd place Original Oratory Winner in the California State tournament, 2nd place Dramatic Interpretation Winner for the California District, the Japanese-American League Oratorical Winner for the Pacific Region, the Bank of America Liberal Arts Scholar, the Elks Club Student Leader, and received several scholarships to Stanford University, at which she studied receiving an English Honors Degree, and

BA in English, and an MA in education.

After college, Ms. Brown went on to teach at Iolani Preparatory Academy in Hawaii, which was an all boys school. She taught grades 7-8 and 10-12. Other locations in which Ms. Brown has instructed include Stanford University, the Hiroshima YMCA College of Foreign Languages, Hiroshima First Girls Commercial High School, Craven Community College, Skagit Valley Community College, as well as the Navy Campus, instructing Writing for Staff NCOs and Basic English Skills. Ms. Brown came to East Carteret 5 years ago at the invitation of Dr. Curtis Fleishman, who saw her as an answer to an unusual problem when a teacher suddenly resigned.

Here at East, Ms. Brown has made herself so much at home. The students have fallen in love with her, and she with them. She can easily recall any student's research paper from any year, which shows that she truly cares about each one of her students. Ms. Brown's accomplishments are far too great to merely list on one page. In all actuality, this whole book could be filled with the accomplishments she has made and the stories of the lives she has touched.

Aside from her never-ending task as a teacher, Ms. Brown is also has a mother to daughter, Courtney who is now attending college. She has a sister who teaches at San Francisco State University. Ms. Brown also found a new venture in which to take part, the church. She proudly exclaims that she found the Lord in 1997 and has been an active member of her church ever since. In 1998 she joined the choir of her church and has enjoyed singing with them ever since. In addition to her work at church, Ms. Brown enjoys running, reading the Bible, ruminating about her students, lesson plans, and her speech and debate team. She says that martial arts and private plane flying are currently on hold, but it is well known, nothing stays on hold with Ms. Brown for too long.
